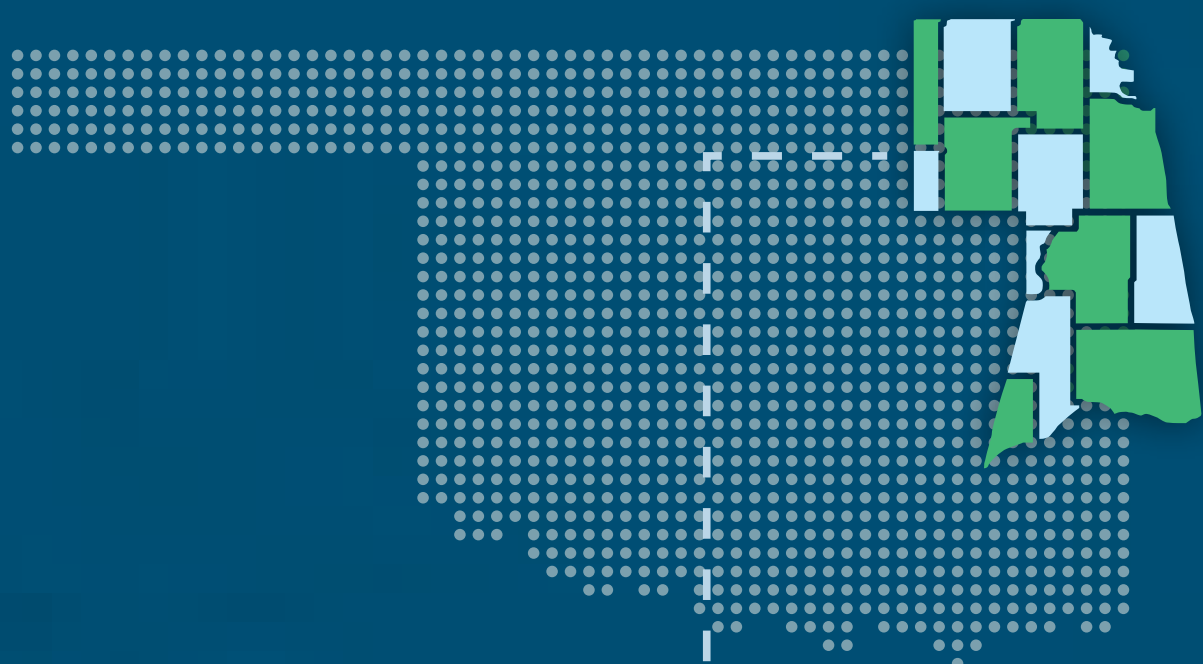


THE CHEROKEE NATION

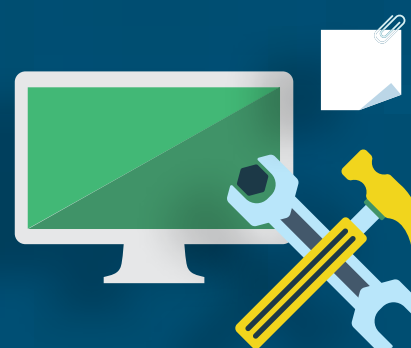

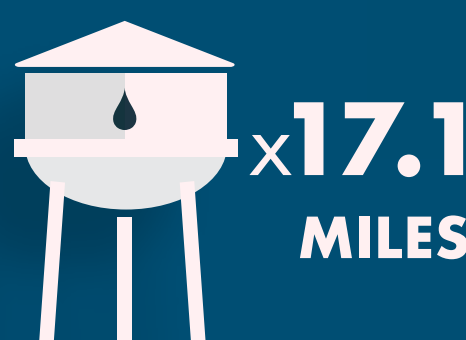

ROADS



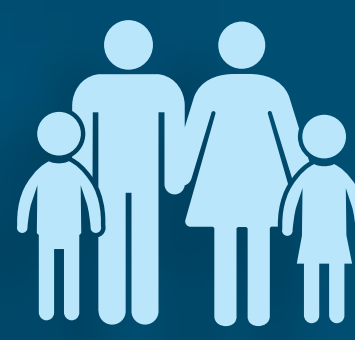
Built or repaired nearly **91 miles** of roads

WATER & SANITATION



Installed **17.1 miles** of water lines and completed **672** water improvement projects.

HUMAN SERVICES



Delivered **146,790 meals** to elders and provided **3,155 households** with low-income heating and energy assistance.

HEALTH SERVICES



Served **1.57 million patient visits** and filled **1.7 million prescriptions** in 2021.



Behavioral Health Program treated **12,765 patients**.



851 babies were born at W.W. Hastings Hospital.



Assisted **10,907 patients** in the Cherokee Nation Diabetes Program.



55,907 patient visits to Cherokee Nation Dental Clinics.

EDUCATION



SCHOLARSHIPS provided higher education totaling more than **\$19.6 million** to students.



Since 2003, **\$84, million** to Oklahoma public schools from car tag sales.



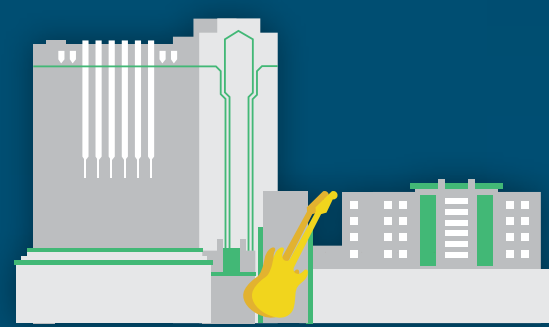
CHEROKEE LANGUAGE

Durbin Feeling Language Preservation Act provided an additional **\$16 million investment** into preserving the Cherokee language, and established the Durbin Feeling Language Center in Tahlequah, OK. This was the largest language investment in Cherokee Nation history.



HOUSING

\$30 million to repair Cherokee homes across northeastern Oklahoma was invested after Cherokee Nation passed the Housing, Jobs & Sustainable Communities Act.



GAMING COMPACT

Since 2005, Cherokee Nation has paid **\$434.7 million** in State Compact Fees to Oklahoma.



SCHOOL FUNDING

\$7.4 million of Cherokee Nation car tag revenue was allocated to public schools throughout the reservation in 2021.



TRANSIT

99,463 passengers utilized Cherokee Nation's transit system in 2021. The fleet recently added two electric-powered, zero-emission buses.



CLEAN WATER

Thanks to the Wilma P. Mankiller & Charlie Soap Water act, Cherokee Nation secured at least **\$2 million** in additional funding each year for eliminating barriers to clean water access in the reservation.



TERO SPENDING

In 2021, Cherokee Nation spent **\$108.5 million** with TERO vendors. This is a **153% increase** since 2018.



CAREER TRAINING

5,915 citizens were provided with career training & placement from Cherokee Nation in 2021. Cherokee Nation doubled its investment in career training programs in 2019.
